Introduction

UCR - Uniform Crime Reporting

NIBRS – National Incident-Based Reporting System

What is UCR?

A nationwide, cooperative statistical effort of more than 18,000 city, university and college, county, state, tribal, and federal law enforcement agencies (LEAs) voluntarily reporting data on offenses reported or known.

UCR Program Purposes

1. Produces a nationwide view of crime based upon statistics
2. Provides a common language for the different criminal statutes.
3. Allows for the publication of Crime in the United States and other trend releases.

NIBRS Benefits

1. Distinction between attempted and completed crimes.
2. Detailed crime analyses can be made within and across Law Enforcement jurisdictions.
3. Arrests and clearances can be linked to specific incidents and offenses.

4. Assist in agency planning.
5. Forecasting crime occurrences.
6. Early detection of crime trends.
7. Identify drug/alcohol/computer involvement with crime.
8. Assist research to enhance technology.
9. Assist in re-evaluation of record-keeping systems.
10. Greater focus and identification of victim groups.
11. Assists in establishing Modus Operandi records.
12. Easy identification of weapons in crime.

Incident

One or more offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders Acting in concert, at the Same time and place.

NOTE: An incident may consist of one offense or multiple offenses.

Separation of Time and Place

The time interval between the offenses and the distance between the locations where they occurred were insignificant.

The concept of Separation of Time and Place means that normally, the offense must have occurred during an unbroken time period and at the same or adjoining place.

Acting in Concert

The offenders actually commit or assist in the commission of all the crimes in an incident. Once an arrest is made, it will clear the involved incident.

If the offenders did not act in concert, then there is more than one incident involved.

Jurisdiction Purpose

1. To accurately depict the nature and volume of crime in a particular community.
2. To make certain an offense or arrest is not counted more than once by overlapping jurisdictions.

Jurisdiction Guidelines

1. City, university and college, county, state, tribal, and federal LEA's should report offenses that occur within their jurisdictions.
2. When two or more city, university and college, county, state, tribal, or federal LEAs are involved in the investigation of the same offense, the agency with investigative jurisdiction based on city, local, university and college, county, state, tribal, and federal law and/or applicable interagency agreements or memorandums of understanding (MOU) should report the offense. If there is uncertainty as to the lead or primary agency, the agencies must agree on which agency should report the offense.
3. LEAs will report only those arrests made for offenses committed within their own jurisdictions.
4. The recovery of property should be reported only by the LEA that first reported it missing and/or stolen, regardless of which agency recovered it.

Assault Offenses

An unlawful attack by one person upon another

Aid to Classifying Assaults

1. The type of weapon employed or the use of an object as a weapon.
2. The seriousness of the injury.
3. The intent and capability of the assailant to cause serious injury.

Note: By definition there can be no attempted assaults.

Aggravated Assault 13A

An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon OR displays it in a threatening manner, OR the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness

Simple Assault 13B

An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness

Intimidation 13C

To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or

other conduct but **without** displaying a weapon or **subjecting** the victim to actual physical attack

Homicide Offenses

The killing of one human being by another

Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter 09A

The **willful** (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Generally, any **death due to injuries** received in a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is classified in this category.

Negligent Manslaughter 09B

The killing of another person through negligence

Include Killings from:

- Hunting Accidents
- Gun Cleaning
- Children playing with guns
- Arrests associated with driving under the influence
- Distracted Driving(using a cell/smartphone)
- Reckless driving traffic fatalities

Justified Homicide 09C

The killing of a perpetrator of a serious criminal offense by a peace officer in the line of duty, or the killing, during the commission of a serious criminal offense, of the perpetrator by a private individual

The crime that was being committed when the Justifiable Homicide took place must be reported in a separate incident.

Human Trafficking Commercial Sex Acts 64A

Inducing a person by Force, fraud, or coercion to participate in commercial sex acts, or in which the person induced to perform such act(s) has **not attained 18 years of age**

Human Trafficking Involuntary Servitude 64B

The obtaining of a person(s) through recruitment, harboring, transportation, or provision, and subjecting such persons by force, fraud, or coercion into involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery (not to include commercial sex acts)

Kidnapping / Abduction 100

The unlawful seizure, transportation, and/or detention of a person against his/her will or of a minor without the consent of his/her custodial parent(s) or legal guardian

Include hostage and parental abduction situations.

Sex Offenses

Any sexual act directed against another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent

Rape 11A

The carnal knowledge of a person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity

Sodomy 11B

Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity

Sexual Assault with an Object 11C

To use an object (including finger) or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity

Fondling 11D

The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her age or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity

Incest 36A

Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.

Statutory Rape 36B

Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.

Crimes Classifications – Crimes Against Persons

Scenario # 1

A man was arguing with his neighbor over the property line. He threatened to go get his gun and shoot the neighbor. The man left the scene and never returned.

What are the reportable NIBRS Offense(s)?

Intimidation

Scenario # 2

A gunman shot into a crowd of eight people killing three people. The police subdued the offender and placed him under arrest.

What are the reportable NIBRS Offense(s)?

Homicide with three victims and Agg Assault for the other five victims

Scenario # 3

A man was in a fight on the tenth floor of a building. During the fight, he was knocked through a window and fell to his death. No arrest was made.

What are the reportable NIBRS Offense(s)?

Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter

Scenario # 4

A neighbor discovered an infant who had been beaten. The neighbor rushed the infant to the hospital. The infant later dies as a direct result of the injuries. The investigation revealed that the mother was responsible. The mother was not considered

mentally competent, and the district attorney did not wish to prosecute.

Arson 200

To unlawful and intentionally damage or attempt to damage any real or personal property by fire or incendiary device

Arsons perpetrated in one locale and spread to another should be reported by the jurisdiction in which the fire originated.

Bribery 510

The offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value (e.g., a bribe, gratuity, or kickback) to sway the judgement or action of a person in a position of trust or influence

Note: Excludes Sports Bribery.

Burglary/Breaking and Entering 220

The unlawful entry into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a felony or a theft

A structure has “four walls, a roof, and a door.”

Hotel Rule includes:

- Hotels/Motels
- Lodging Houses
- Lodging of Transients
- Temporary Rental Storage
- Mini-storage Facilities

Counterfeiting/Forgery 250

The altering, copying, or imitation of something, without authority or right with the intent to deceive or defraud by passing the copy or thing altered or imitated as that which is original or genuine; or the selling, buying, or possession of an altered, copied, or imitated thing with the intent to deceive or defraud

Destruction/Damage Vandalism of Property 290

To willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface, or otherwise injure real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.

Should be reported if the agency deems that the damage is substantial.

Note: If the investigation suspects that the offense was a Hate Crime then it must be reported.

Embezzlement 270

The unlawful misappropriation by an offender to his/her own use or purpose of money, property, or some other thing of value entrusted to his/her care, custody, or control.

Extortion/Blackmail 210

To unlawfully obtain money, property, or any other thing of value, either tangible or intangible, through the use or threat of force, misuse of authority, threat of criminal prosecution, threat of destruction of reputation or social standing, or through other coercive means

Fraud Offenses

The intentional perversion of the truth for the purpose of inducing another person or other entity in reliance upon it to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right.

False Pretenses/Swindle/Confidence Game 26A

The intentional misrepresentation of existing fact or condition or the use of some other deceptive scheme or device to obtain money, goods, or other things of value

Credit Card/Automatic Teller Machine Fraud 26B

The unlawful use of a credit (or debit) card or automated teller machine for fraudulent purposes.

Impersonation 26C

Falsely representing one's identity or position and acting in the character or position thus unlawfully assumed to deceive others and thereby gain a profit or advantage, enjoy some right or privilege, or subject another person or entity to an expense, charge, or liability that would not have otherwise been incurred

Welfare Fraud 26D

The use of deceitful statements, practices, or devices to unlawfully obtain welfare benefits

Wire Fraud 26E

The use of an electric or electronic communications facility to intentionally transmit a false and/or deceptive message in furtherance of a fraudulent activity

Identity Theft 26F

Wrongfully obtaining and using another person's personal data (e.g., name, date of birth, Social Security number, driver's license number).

Hacking Computer Invasion 26G

Wrongfully gaining access to another person's or institution's computer software, hardware, or networks without authorized permissions or security clearances.

Larceny/Theft Offenses

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another person

Larceny and Theft mean the same thing in UCR.

Pocket-picking 23A

The theft of articles from another person's physical possession by stealth where the victim usually does not become immediately aware of the theft

Purse-snatching 23B

The grabbing or snatching of a purse, handbag, etc., from the physical possession of another person

Shoplifting 23C

The theft by someone other than an employee of the victim of goods or merchandise exposed for sale

Theft from a Building 23D

A theft from within a building which is either open to the general public or to which the offender has legal access

Theft from Coin Operated Machine or Device 23E

A theft from a machine or device which is operated or activated by the use of coins (includes credit card only machine)

Theft from a Motor Vehicle 23F

The theft of articles from a motor vehicle, locked or unlocked

Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories 23G

The theft of any part or accessory **affixed** to the interior or exterior of a motor vehicle in a manner which would make the item an attachment of the vehicle or necessary for its operation

All Other Larceny 23H

All thefts that do not fit any of the definitions of the specific subcategories of Larceny/Theft

Motor Vehicle Theft 240

The theft of a motor vehicle

Motor Vehicle is defined as: A self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface of land and not rails

What are four offenses where a vehicle is taken unlawfully but not reported as a Motor Vehicle Theft to UCR?

Robbery 120

The taking or attempting to take anything of value under confrontational circumstances from the control, custody, or care of another person by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm

Stolen Property Offenses 280

Receiving, buying, selling, possessing, concealing, or transporting any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by burglary, embezzlement, fraud, larceny, robbery, etc.

Animal Cruelty 720

Intentionally, Knowingly, or recklessly taking an action that mistreats or kills any animal without just cause, such as torturing, tormenting, mutilation, maiming, poisoning, or abandonment.

Drug/Narcotic Offenses

The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.

Drug Narcotic Violations 35A

The unlawful cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, purchase, use, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug or narcotic substance

Drug Equipment Violations 35B

The unlawful manufacture, sale, purchase, possession, or transportation of equipment or devices utilized in preparing and/or using drugs or narcotics

Gambling Offenses

To unlawfully bet or wager money or something else of value; assist, promote, or operate a game of chance for money or some other stake; possess or transmit wagering information; manufacture, sell, purchase, possess, or transport gambling equipment, devices, or goods; or tamper with the outcome of a sporting event or contest to gain a gambling advantage

Betting/Wagering 39A

To unlawfully stake money or something else of value on the happening of an uncertain event or on the ascertainment of a fact in dispute

Operating/Promoting/Assisting Gambling 39B

To unlawfully operate, promote, or assist in the operation of a game of chance, lottery, or other gambling activity

Gambling Equipment Violations 39C

To unlawfully manufacture, sell, buy, possess, or transport equipment, devices, and/or goods used for gambling purposes

Sports Tampering 39D

To unlawfully alter, meddle in, or otherwise interfere with a sporting contest or event for the purpose of gaining a gambling advantage

Pornography/Obscene Material 370

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, publishing, sale, purchase, or possession of sexually explicit material, e.g., literature or photographs

Prostitution Offenses

To unlawfully engage in or promote sexual activities for anything of value

Prostitution 40A

To engage in commercial sex acts for anything of value

Assisting or Promoting Prostitution 40B

To solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution

Purchasing Prostitution 40C

To purchase or trade anything of value for commercial sex acts

Weapons Law Violation 520

The violation of laws or ordinances the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons

Bad Checks 90A

Knowingly and intentionally writing and/or negotiating checks drawn against insufficient or nonexistent funds

Excludes counterfeit or forged checks

Curfew/Loitering/Vagrancy Violation 90B

The violation of a court order, regulation, ordinance, or law requiring the withdrawal of persons from the streets or other specified areas; prohibiting persons from remaining in an area or place in an idle or aimless manner; or prohibiting persons from going from place to place without visible means of support

Includes begging, vagabondage & panhandling, etc.

Disorderly Conduct 90C

Any behavior that tends to disturb the public peace or decorum, scandalize the community, or shock the public sense of morality

Does not include physical confrontations

Driving Under the Influence 90D

Driving or operating a motor vehicle or common carrier while mentally or physically impaired as the result of consuming an alcoholic beverage or using a drug or narcotic

Includes an airplane, boat, bus, streetcar, train

Drunkenness 90E

To drink alcoholic beverages to the extent that one's mental faculties and physical coordination are substantially impaired

Drunk & disorderly, public intoxication, habitual drunkard (Will eventually be eliminated as a NIBRS offense)

Family Offenses, Nonviolent 90F

Unlawful, nonviolent acts by a family member (or legal guardian) that threaten the physical, mental, or economic well-being or morals of another family member and that are not classifiable as other offenses, such as Assault, Incest, and Statutory Rape.

Includes abandonment, desertion, neglect, nonsupport, nonviolent abuse/cruelty

Liquor Law Violations 90G

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages

Peeping Tom 90H

To secretly look through a window, doorway, keyhole, or other aperture for the purpose of voyeurism

Trespass of Real Property 90J

To unlawfully enter land, a dwelling, or other real property

All Other Offenses 90Z

All crimes that are not Group A offenses and not included in one of the specifically named Group B crime categories listed previously

Data Elements – Administrative (Segment Level 1)

LEVEL 1: Administrative Segment

Data Element 1 (ORI)

Originating Agency Identifier

This is a unique nine-character number.

Data Element 2 (Incident Number)

Identifies each Incident

Data Element 2A (Cargo Theft)

The criminal taking of any cargo including, but not limited to goods, chattels, money, or baggage that constitutes, in whole or in part, a commercial shipment of freight moving in commerce, from any pipeline system, railroad car, motor truck, or other vehicle, or from any tank or storage facility, station house, platform, or depot, or from any vessel or wharf, or from any aircraft, air terminal, airport, aircraft terminal or air freight station, warehouse, freight distribution facility, or freight consolidation facility. For purposes of this definition, cargo shall be deemed as moving in commerce at all points between the point of origin and the final destination, regardless of any temporary stop while awaiting transshipment or otherwise.

Must be part of a Commercial shipment

Must be in the Supply chain

Data Element 3 (Incident Date)

If the date is Unknown use the date of the report w/the indicator R=Report.

Use the beginning of the time period that the incident occurred. If the date is unknown, use the date of the report with the indicator “R=Report”

Date Element 4 (Cleared Exceptionally)

To clear an offense by exceptional means, LEAs must meet all four of the following conditions:

1. Investigation must have clearly and definitely established the **identity of at least one offender**.
2. Must have **sufficient probable cause** to support arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender
3. Must **know the exact location of the offender** so they can make an arrest if circumstances did not prevent it.
4. There must be a **reason outside the control of the LEA** preventing the arrest, charging, and turning over for prosecution.

Valid Data Values:

A = Death of Offender

B = Prosecution Declined

(by the prosecutor for other than lack of probable cause)

C = In Custody of Other Jurisdiction

(includes extradition denied)

D = Victim Refused to Cooperate (in the prosecution)

E = Juvenile/No Custody
(the handling of a juvenile without taking him/her into custody, but rather by **oral or written notice given to the parents or legal guardian in a case involving a minor offense**, such as petty larceny)

N = Not Applicable
(not cleared exceptionally)

Date Element 5 (Exceptional Clearance Date)

If any code but “N” is used in the Cleared Exceptionally Data Element, then enter the date YYYY/MM/DD.

NOTE: Clearance of an incident should not be confused with closing the investigation.

Enter the 10 most serious Group A Crimes in an incident.

Date Element 7 (Offense Attempted / Completed)

C = Computer Equipment (Handheld

Offender was suspected of consuming or using drugs during or shortly before the incident.

Offender used computer equipment to perpetrate the crime.

Date Element 8A (Bias Motivation)

A criminal offense that is motivated in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity

Valid Data Values:

Enter **one location** for each offense.

Report the type of location/premises where each offense in an incident took place (Where initiated).

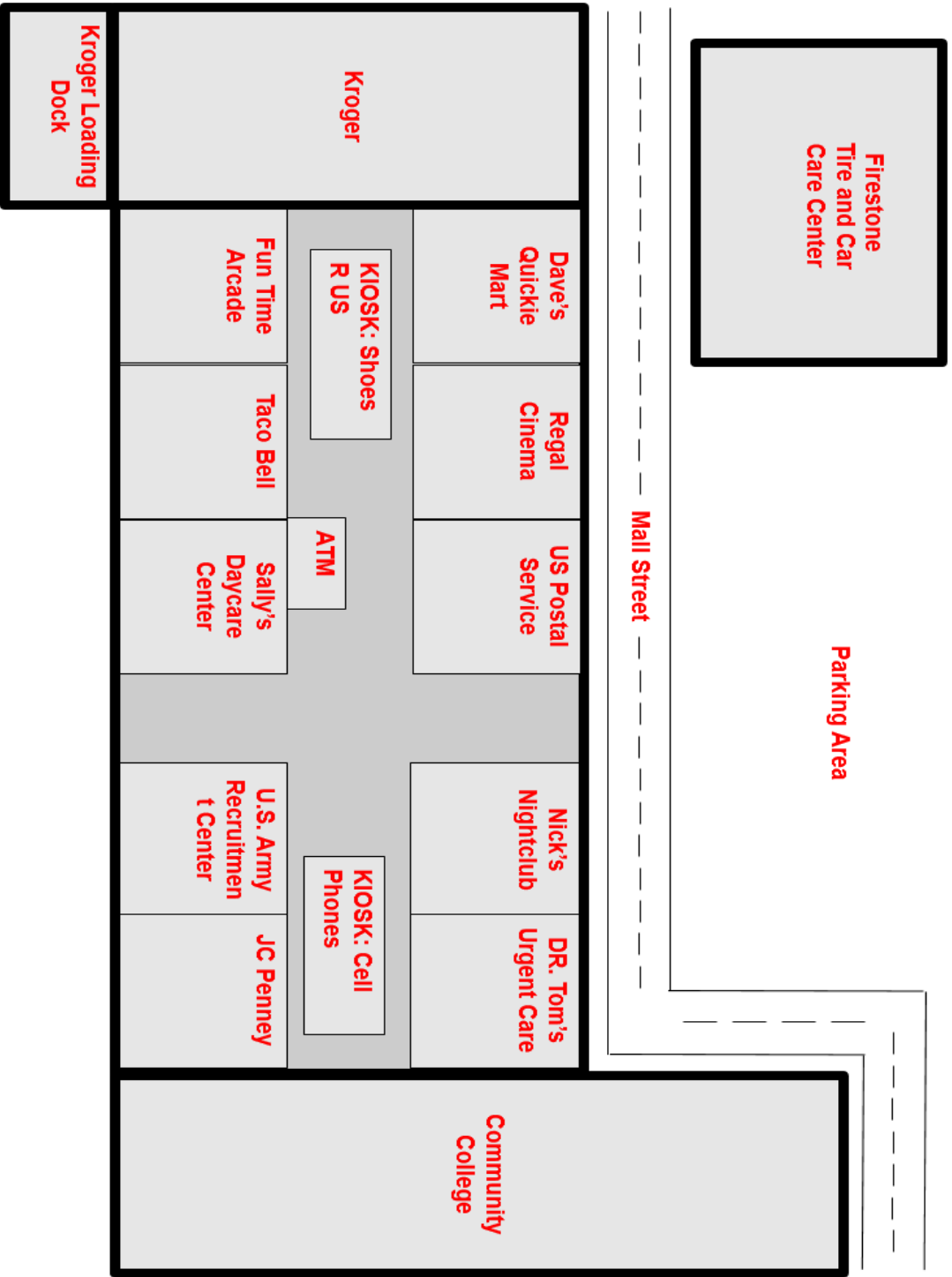
